BARGE DART.—District Court of the United States for the Eastern District of Michigan, ss In Admiralty. Whereas three libels have been filed in said court on August 18, 1866, against the barge Dart, and her boats, tackle, apparel and furniture, intervening under the libel of Campbell & Mills; one by Robert J. Hackett, John Sloan and John J. Bazley, claiming that there is due them for towing said barge with their tug, the Zouave, on July 19, 1866, from Detroit to Port Huron, and, on August 1, 1866, from Port Huron to Detroit, Seventy Dollars and interest; one by Charles H. Carey, claiming for towing said barge with his tug, the Hector, on July 29, 1-66, from Detroit to Port Huron, Thirty five Dollars; and one by Miron Williams and Henry McMoran, claiming for towing said barge with their tug, the Tawas, on July 22, 1-66, from Port Huron to Detroit, Thirty-five Dollars, payment of which sums, it is alleged, hath been demanded and refused: Therefore, by virtue of process issued out of and under seal of said court, to me directed and delivered, I have seized and have now in custody said barge Dart, her boats, &c; and I do hereby cite the master, owners and claimants of said barge, and all others having interest therein, to appear in said court, at the United States District Court-room in Detroit, Mich., on the first Tuesday of September, 1866, at ten o'clock a.m., if that be a day of jurisdiction if not, on the next day of jurisdiction thereafter, then and there to answer said libels, and to make their allegations in that behalf.
